

Concrete cores of residential towers reached completion, whilst beneath the surface works to connect the Town Centre to the heating grid have now finished. 

KEY:

- 1. Heating Connection: Excavation and tunnelling works for the services tunnel, which will provide the heating link, are complete
- 2. Towers 2 & 3 (22 storey and 20 storey residential towers): Both concrete cores are now complete
- 3. New UAL: LCC Campus Building: Façade installation has progressed to level 5
- 4. Tower 1 (34 storey residential tower): Concrete core poured up to level 31
- Works along Elephant Road to bring the heating connection to the new development are now complete. Excavation and tunnelling works for the services tunnel are also complete, which will provide the link to district heating throughout the development. The footpath along Elephant Road has now been reinstated to its original condition.
- The concrete structure above the Bakerloo Line tunnels which houses the integrated ticket hall (ITH) has progressed well, with the ground floor concrete slab complete. Construction work on the columns and walls within the structure is also progressing well.
- The E1 (12 storey new UAL: LCC campus building) concrete core is complete and floor slabs have been poured up to level 12. Installation of the façade has also commenced to the ground floor and up to level

6 of the north, south and east elevations. In the building's north, south and central atriums, eight sets of the feature stairs have now been installed.

- The tower 1 (34 storey residential tower) concrete core is now poured to level 31 and concrete floor slabs are now poured up to levels 28 on the south side and 22 on the north side. The precast façade has progressed to level 11 and bathroom pods have been loaded out up to level 18.
- The tower 2 & 3 (22 storey and 20 storey residential towers) concrete cores are now both complete, and concrete floor slabs are now poured up to levels 20 and 19. Façade panel installation has progressed up to level 8 in tower 2 and level 6 in tower 3, whilst bathroom pods have been loaded out up to levels 13 and 11 respectively.
- There are currently three vehicle entry/exit gates and two external pit lanes in use across the project, managed by teams of dedicated trained traffic marshals through Multiplex's supply chain partner, Clipfine.
- At present, approximately 780 people are working on the project every day, from operatives (c. 650) to management staff (c. 130).
- The Multiplex team knows how important it is to engage with the local community through regular neighbourhood liaison. Multiplex continues to encourage their workforce to support local businesses by spending locally.

ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY UPDATE

EMBODIED CARBON

The design of key aspects of the development has catered for the use of reclaimed steel sections, which reduce carbon emissions and delivers on circular economy principles. The first of these steel sections are now being installed on the crowns of two of the residential towers.

ONSITE AIR QUALITY

Various trade contractors have opted to use electric or hybrid-based equipment, which helps to ensure that any carbon emissions and pollutants are minimised. An educational toolbox talk focussing on Clean Air Day was held on June 20th.
